A Lab on Document Forgery

Objective

You will analyze handwriting on a questioned document to determine the author of the document.

Background Information

Royston Textiles called the state bureau of investigation last week to report a problem with one of their canceled checks. This check was made out to their consultant, Julian Harston. It had been mailed to him more than a month ago. However, Mr. Harston reported that he never received the check. Yet, the canceled check was in Royston Textiles' bank statement this month. It had been endorsed.

Mr. Harston feels that someone in his neighborhood took the check from his mailbox and forged his name on the back. Today you are provided with copies of Julian Harston's signature written by people in his neighborhood. Your job is to decide which signature most closely matches the one on the check. This decision will help you determine if the check endorsement was forged.

Materials

Stereomicroscope or hand lens

Unlined white paper

Document in question

Black pens, all of same brand, one per lab group

Protractor (optional)

Ruler

Paper clip

Notebook paper

Scissors

Procedure, Day 1

- 1. In Figure 2 you see a check that has been written with a typewriter. It is made out to Julian Harston and signed with a Royston Textile stamp.
- 2. Cut out the check with scissors.
- 3. Turn the check over and write the name Julian Harston on the back.
- 4. Write your name on a piece of notebook paper and attach the check to this notebook paper with a paper clip. Give this to your teacher.

Procedure, Day 2

- 1. Your teacher has selected one of the checks that was turned in yesterday and made severa copies of the back of that check for each lab group. In today's lab, your copy of that chec is referred to as "the document in question."




Figure 3. Day 2.

- 2. Each person in your lab group should cut out the check in Figure 3 and sign the nam Julian Harston to the back in his or her own handwriting. Write your name on a piece (notebook paper and attach the check to the notebook paper with a paper clip. Place this o the table at the front of the room, so that each person's paper is side by side.
- 3. Your lab group is a team of handwriting examiners. Using the information in th Background, the document in question provided by the teacher, microscope, ruler, and pre tractor, examine the check your teacher handed out to you today. Complete the "Analys of the Document in Question."

4.	Taking turns with other lab groups, compare the checks at the front of the room with th analysis. Determine which student committed the forgery.
